Summary of Program Accomplishments

Fun 5

Utilizing a Hawaii State Grant-in-Aid, the Fun 5 training program continued across the state of Hawaii. In total, 30 trainers were trained through the SPARK curriculum and the Fun 5 coordinator provided continuous support, as needed. Partnerships with the Kapiolani Community College Culinary Arts Program, Fun 5 Trainers, and local afterschool providers continue to make this statewide initiative a success.

Keiki Great Aloha Run

The 2017 Keiki Great Aloha Run, sponsored by Kaiser Permanente, was a grand success attracting over 2,700 participants and collecting over \$35,000 to be donated back to the students' schools. This annual event was once again hosted at the Neal S. Blaisdell Center and received tremendous community support from community groups and businesses such as Meadow Gold Dairies, McKinley High School, the City and County of Honolulu, YMCA of Honolulu, La Tour Bakehouse, and Hawaii 5210.

Hawaii Senior Olympics

The Hawaii Senior Olympics was not a qualifying event for the National Senior Games in 2017, therefore, the games will continue in 2018 to prepare for the 2019 National Senior Games in New Mexico.

Aloha State Games

The Aloha State Games was successfully coordinated in a few sports in 2017. Activities may continue in 2018, based on interest and capacity.

Hawaii Afterschool Alliance

In 2017, the 3rd year since the founding of the Hawaii Afterschool Alliance, the organization established the Hawaii Afterschool Quality Guidelines, convened over 200 professionals at the Hawaii Afterschool Summit, championed multiple legislative initiatives resulting in the allocation of \$1.5 million for afterschool programs, and increased media and public awareness about the benefits of afterschool and summer programs for youth, families, and the community.
